

An honor for Westlake High School:

Nine Fulton high schools named AP Honor Schools (extracts)

Georgia Superintendent Kathy Cox announced that nine Fulton County high schools are AP Honor Schools during a recent speech to the Georgia Association of Educational Leaders.

Westlake High School is one of 40 “AP Access and Support Schools.” The distinction recognizes schools with at least 30 percent of their AP test-takers identified as African-American or Hispanic, and with 30 percent of the total AP exams earning scores of three or higher.

Advanced Placement classes and exams are administered by the college board and offer rigorous college-level learning options to students in high school. Scores range from one to five. Students who receive a three, four or five on AP exams are eligible to receive college credit or may be exempt from some introductory college courses.
